I'm 54 years old and just completed the book cover to cover. I've read a lot of programming and 3D books but this is absolutely the best book I've ever read and worth every dime and then some. Very

clear step-by-step instructions!! If you want to learn 3ds Max then this is the book for you. And I am not a publisher saying this, I'm a consumer and computer programmer like you!

This is an excellent book. I am nearly 63 years of age and have attention deficit issues. I am now three chapters into this book and find it very easy to follow and concentrate on. I have to read most things a couple of times to get the wording all in order and fully comprehend them but that is me not the book. I find that issue is greatly minimized with this book. I am enjoying learning 3d Max 2013 because the book is very easy to understand. It uses very concise sentences which for me is just what I need in order to progress through each section. The author does not engage in superfluous language, jargon or acronyms. This book works very well for someone like myself who has to make an extra effort to follow along. If you do not have the issues I have you should be able to learn 3d Max 2013 rapidly and well with this book.

This is an excellent but at times tough to follow book (especially if you're a beginner ... expect a lot of disappointment / frustration, but stick with it and you'll get there in the end) My only negative observation would be this: some of the example exercises are needlessly complicated. For example, on Chapter 13 it's nigh on impossible to follow the Sun / Moon / Planets exercise. I think the points could have been made without creating 4 planets in addition to a Sun / Moon, and multiple helpers. I've even tried (twice) to draw up a schematic from going through it, to no avail. I simply decided to move on. Thankfully this is more so an exception than the rule. It's an excellent product, but could do with some of that flab cut out of it. Creating multiple objects for the hell of it doesn't really add to the learning experience.

In a few more words: Informative, Organized, Comprehensible. As a lifelong learner and a college-level 3DS Max instructor, I know the value of well-written explanations and frustration-free examples, and Jeff delivers on both counts with "Mastering 3ds Max". It makes a big difference for students when the materials do not get in the way of learning and enjoying the program. I've used a lot of books in my years teaching, and Jeff's "Mastering 3ds Max" is my choice for both my Intro and Advanced 3ds Max classes. If you are an instructor, be sure to check out the Instructor Companion Site on the Sybex web site and the wealth of materials Jeff produced to assist you in teaching with his book. I know Jeff through the 3ds Max community and as a fellow Sybex author, and know the tremendous amount of work that went into the creation of this book. Jeff's talent shows in every page, and no matter what your experience level with 3ds Max (I'm over 20 years) you will learn a lot

as you work through the book. If you want to be knowledgeable and efficient in 3ds Max, read this book cover-to-cover. I give it a very well-deserved five stars.

As for the content of this book, it's a bit dry, but that's the nature of all technical books. Just make sure you're wide awake before commencing reading.
